This summer, San Elijo Lagoon Conservancy announces its open application process for potential volunteers who are interested in communicating the beauty and wonders of wetlands to people of all ages. Interpretive training will provide volunteers, with all levels of experience, the tools to lead walks.

Many of the reserve's trailheads originate in Solana Beach. Last year, Conservancy naturalist - docents led hundreds of walks for nearly 3,000 visitors. The Conservancy's greatest volunteer need is to lead school children on field trips, with a majority of students in elementary grades. In addition, the Conservancy offers Weekend Walks for the public on Saturdays and walks for specially-arranged community and scout groups.

As naturalists with the Conservancy, docents help support the mission to protect and enhance San Elijo Lagoon Ecological Reserve by fostering stewardship and appreciation of the protected wetland environment.

The application deadline is September 24. The eight-week training course is held Tuesday mornings at San
