Restoring Tidal Flow at San Elijo Lagoon's Ocean Connection Begins October 11 San Elijo Lagoon Conservancy Oversees Sand Removal and Dispersal at Cardiff State Beach

ENCINITAS – Cardiff State Beach is culturally vibrant to all who love to surf, sunbathe, and build sandcastles by the sea. More sand is coming to its shores. Approximately 25,000-cubic yards of sand will be removed from the San Elijo Lagoon inlet. Half of the sand will be placed nearshore between Pacific Coast Grill & the Charthouse as we do every year. This year, the other half of the excavated sand will be placed between Restaurant Row and South Cardiff State Beach to be used in the creation of dunes for the City of Encinitas-led Cardiff Beach Living Shoreline project

WHO San Elijo Lagoon Conservancy oversees the annual inlet excavation, conducted in support by California Coastal Conservancy and County of San Diego Department of Environmental Health.

WHY The small opening, south of San Elijo State Beach Campground, is the lagoon's connection to the Pacific Ocean. By reconnecting the tidal passage, we improve how tides ebb and flow. Many fishes, birds, plants and invertebrates depend on this unique mix of saltwater and freshwater.

WHERE Cardiff State Beach in Cardiff-by-the-Sea, CA
